


Imagine a similar gathering in a beautiful garden, but instead of the King of England, it's King Jesus arriving. Would there be a triumphant fanfare? Would people throw down their cloaks as they did during his entry into Jerusalem? Would a choir of angels sing? Would his presence be so overwhelming you'd have to hide your face, or would you simply fall to the floor, allowing his grace and peace to shine upon you?

Revelation 1: 9-18 offers a glimpse of King Jesus through John's vision:

"Son of man, dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest. The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance. When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. I am the Living One; I was dead, and now look, I am alive for ever and ever!"

Jesus, King of Kings and Lord of Lords, I bow before Your majesty and power. You are the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the One who reigns forever.
