### Changed For Good: A Reflection on Faith and "Wicked"

The familiar lyric, "I have been changed, for good," will resonate with anyone who has seen the hit musical Wicked, or its recent multi-million-pound sequel, Wicked: For Good.

For the uninitiated, Wicked features music and lyrics by Stephen Schwartz and a book by Winnie Holzman. It is a loose adaptation of Gregory Maguire's 1995 novel Wicked: The Life and Times of the Wicked Witch of the West, which in turn builds on L. Frank Baum's 1900 novel, The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, and the 1939 film adaptation starring Judy Garland.

Set in the Land of Oz, both before and after Dorothy Gale's arrival from Kansas, the story delves into the complicated bond between Elphaba Thropp and Galinda Upland—who become the infamous Wicked Witch of the West and Glinda the Good. Their relationship is tested by their different worldviews, a shared love interest, and their reactions to the Wizard's corrupt regime, leading ultimately to Elphaba's tragic downfall.

The show contains two particularly poignant songs with significant lyrics: "Defying Gravity" and "For Good." The former includes the line: "Something has changed within me, something is not the same". And the latter: "Because I knew you, I have been changed for good".

These lyrics hold deep meaning within the musical's narrative, but they gain even greater significance when viewed through the lens of Christian faith.

When we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour, a fundamental change happens within us; life is forever altered. We are adopted as Sons and Daughters of the Most High, joining a communion of Saints throughout history. And critically, because we **know** Him, we have truly been **changed for good!** 

While we remain a work in progress, God continually changes us daily through the love and peace of the Holy Spirit, through His word, through prayer and relationship, and through worship. We are changed for good because we know Him. It's amazing what a difference changing just one letter can make!

As we enter this season of Advent, let us hold onto the reminder Paul gives in 2 Corinthians (5:17): that in Christ, "the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"


