A heatwave of faith...

As we drove on Pentecost Sunday, the newsreaders on the radio reported that several areas of the country were expected to hit official heatwave levels this week. Indeed, much of the UK has been experiencing soaring temperatures, just as they predicted... it's been a hot one, hasn't it?!

In Acts 2, we read that "they saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them." Fire that did not destroy, but filled. Fire that brought courage, boldness, unity, and new life through the power of the Holy Spirit.

As I've been reflecting on the warm weather this week, I've found myself wondering: what would it look like for a different kind of heatwave to spread through our churches, communities, nation, and world? A heatwave of faith. A fresh movement of the Holy Spirit drawing people to the love of Jesus, renewing weary hearts, and setting lives ablaze with hope, joy, and purpose.

It makes me think of the words from "Shine Jesus Shine" by Graham Kendrick — "set our hearts on fire." What a simple but powerful Pentecost prayer. That God would stir something fresh within us through His Holy Spirit, helping us to shine His light into the world around us.

Pentecost reminds us that faith was never meant to remain still or hidden away. The disciples were transformed by the Spirit and sent out into the world carrying the good news of Jesus. The fire of Pentecost was not only for them — it is for us too. So perhaps this week, alongside the sunshine and rising temperatures, we can pray for hearts to be set on fire once again for God. Let's pray for a heatwave of faith to flow through our church, our community, our nation, and our world — that more people would come to know the love of Jesus, and that more hearts would burn brightly for Him.

Come, Holy Spirit, set our hearts on fire with Your love once again. Pour out Your presence upon Your church, our community, our nation, and our world. Where there is weariness, bring renewal. Where there is fear, bring courage. Where hearts feel cold or distant, bring the warmth of Your grace and truth. May a fresh wave of faith rise up, and may more people come to know and follow the Lord Jesus. Amen.
