I am a child of God!

I'm sure you would agree that we are living in uncertain times. Our world can feel increasingly unstable, unsafe, and broken on many levels — politically, financially, militarily, environmentally, and perhaps personally too. It would be easy to give in to despair and fear as we watch events unfold on our television screens. What will happen next? Where will it all lead? Is our world doomed?

The Bible gives us good news and a reason to hope. "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it" (Psalm 24:1). What a gentle reminder that nothing exists by chance. God, our Creator, is in control. The world, its beauty, its resources, and every life belong to Him. On a personal level, we can sometimes feel uncertain too. Am I safe? Does God really care about me?

The good news is that He most certainly does. Almighty God loved us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to be our Saviour, so that we might be forgiven, transformed, and made new. Nothing and no one can change that. We can be certain that our lives are in God's hands. A few Sundays ago we sang these words: "I'm no longer a slave to fear, I am a child of God." As we sang, I found myself particularly struck by those two simple words: I am. I am a child of God. They are small words, but they carry a powerful truth. They tell us something certain, definite, and unchanging — not because we deserve it, but because God has said it, and Jesus has made it possible.

In John's Gospel we read that Jesus came into the world He had created, yet many did not recognise Him and rejected Him. But we are also given this wonderful promise: "Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God." (John 1:12) What an incredible assurance. In a world full of uncertainty, we can know who we are and whose we are.

Father God we thank you so very much that your unconditional love for each of us can be seen in the life, death and resurrection of your Son Jesus. We are grateful for the certain truth that you walk this life with us, and if we have responded to your love and believed in your name, then we ARE CHILDREN OF GOD. Hallelujah! Please help us to share this good news with those we know and meet. Amen.
