(It's) Coming Home...

Over the last few weeks, we've heard the phrase "it's coming home" ringing out once again as the Three Lions chased World Cup glory. Sadly, it wasn't to be, with more heartbreak for England against old rivals Argentina. Yet as I've heard that familiar phrase repeated, I've found myself thinking about what it means to come home from a Christian perspective.

For many of us, home is more than just a building. It's a place of welcome, belonging, safety, and love. It's where we are known and accepted, where we can finally stop striving and simply be ourselves. Perhaps nowhere is this pictured more beautifully than in Jesus' parable of the Prodigal Son. After squandering his inheritance and finding himself far from home, the son eventually comes to his senses and begins the long journey back. He rehearses his apology, expecting rejection, perhaps hoping only for tolerance. But before he can even reach the house, his father sees him in the distance, runs to meet him, throws his arms around him, and welcomes him home.

It's one of the most moving pictures of God's love in all of Scripture. The story reminds us that no matter how far we have wandered, no matter how many mistakes we've made, God is always watching, waiting, and longing to welcome us home. Through Jesus, we are invited into a relationship with our heavenly Father — not as servants trying to earn His approval, but as beloved sons and daughters.

As we reach the final King's News before the summer break, many of us will be travelling, visiting family, enjoying holidays, or simply taking some time to rest. Wherever this summer takes us, may we remember that our truest home is found in Christ. His arms remain open, His welcome never fades, and His love never fails. And perhaps, as we enjoy the summer months ahead, we can help others discover what it means to come home to God too.

Heavenly Father, thank You for Your unfailing love and for the welcome You offer each one of us through Jesus. Thank You that when we turn towards You, we find open arms, grace, and a place to belong. As we enter the summer season, help us to rest in Your presence, walk closely with You, and share Your love with those around us. May we know the joy of being at home in You. Amen.
