Let them hear...

Janis recently shared a reflection from Graham Tomlin, former Bishop of Kensington, about a holiday visit to a German church. He noticed how easy it is for familiarity to breed a kind of spiritual laziness. Sitting in a service where he only caught about half the language, he couldn't just coast on autopilot—he had to strain to listen, open his ears a little wider, and pay close attention. The result was that even the most familiar words took on a fresh, striking angle, reminding him that tuning into God's voice takes real heart and effort. It's just like Jesus' frequent call: "Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear" (Matthew 13:9).

We saw that exact kind of engagement right here recently during the final home group services from Erica's group, which featured powerful dramatisations of post-resurrection encounters with Jesus—bringing fresh life to the stories of Mary, Thomas, and Peter. You could literally hear a pin drop in the room as everyone leaned in, listening intently to accounts we've heard a hundred times before, proving that when we truly pay attention, familiar truths spring right back to life.

So, as we step into this new season and dive into our brand-new series, "A Fruitful Life"—exploring what it really means to bear the fruit of the Spirit day by day—let's shake off the spiritual autopilot. Whether we're gathering on a Sunday, opening our Bibles at home, or heading out into our Monday-to-Saturday routines, let's choose to listen intently, give ourselves fully to the Lord, step up and volunteer in new ways, and lean into the gifts He's given each of us to build His church here in Iver and beyond.

Father God, forgive us for the times we let familiarity make us lazy in our faith. Shake us off autopilot this week and open our ears to hear Your voice anew—whether in Your word, in our worship, or right in the middle of our everyday lives. As we kick off this new season and series, fill us afresh by Your Spirit, that we might live lives overflowing with fruit for Your glory right here in Iver and beyond. Amen.

Pray for the church activities as they re-start after the summer break.

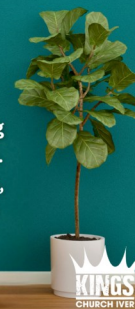
Pray for children and teachers as they return to school after the summer break.
