Great are you Lord

We often sing the song "Great Are You Lord" by the band All Sons and Daughters, and it has become a firm favourite chosen by our worship leaders. But last Sunday, James offered a timely encouragement towards the end of the song, urging us to really slow down and think about the actual words we were declaring.

Each of us is walking a different path right now, experiencing completely different moments in our faith journey, where some of us are in a good place while others might be finding things tough. Yet James reminded us to truly mean it and sing those words, "Great are you Lord", whether we are standing there with a wide-open heart or through gritted teeth. Because our circumstances do not change who He is, and no matter where we find ourselves, God remains the same and He is still worthy.
